REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- (1) The requirement for admission to Cornerstone Seminary include the following:
 1. Evidence of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ characterized by a consistent Christian lifestyle.
 2. Record academic achievement which meets or exceeds our minimum admission requirements.
- (2)
 1. 4 recent passport size photograph
 2. Recommendation Letter from your Pastor or Spiritual leader
 3. Medical Fitness Certificate
 - GCE O/L, GCE A/L, DIP, HND, ASSO. Of Arts
 4. Photocopy of all your academic credentials - B.A., BSC, PGD in Arts/SE, MA/MSc, MBA etc
 5. Transcript, if you have been in a higher institution or Bible College
 6. Three to five hundred words testimony of your life, before and after your conversion, call to ministry and leadership, offices you held in your local church or ministry NOTICE:
 - a) Submit the above requirements before the Admission Committee can ascertain admission
 - b) When admission is confirmed, you will pay up front, the admission and one semester fees.
 - c) Receive fill and return all admission forms. d) Admission letter shall be issued by the registrar, to confirm admission.
- (3) Readmission Applicants who were formerly enrolled in Cornerstone University and Theological Seminary, and could not continue who desire readmission should complete sections I,II. A new Pastor's recommendation is necessary for those who have not been in attendance for more than three semesters, and completing the entire application process is required as listed below. SECTION VIII: LIFESTYLE STATEMENT

Cornerstone Seminary is committed to each student's development as a total person for the fulfilment of God's will, focusing not only upon the discovery and development of abilities and gifts, but also upon growth in spiritual maturity. The Cornerstone Seminary community consists of students, faculty, staff and administration. The privilege of belonging to this community includes adherence to certain rules of procedure and conduct which are designed for the best interest of everyone involved. At Cornerstone Seminary, some of these are based on clear biblical imperatives, some are drawn from biblical principles and others are part of the instrumental distinctive that makes us special. As a minimum requirement, each community member is obliged:

1. To utilize time to the best possible advantage by careful study; participant in Christian service responsibilities and faithful attendance at church and college chapel services



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2. To practice discernment in the area of media and entertainment
3. To avoid every form of immorality, including immoral sexual behavior, homosexuality, lying, stealing and cheating.
4. To abstain from possession and use of alcoholic beverage, tobacco and illegal drugs.
5. To abstain from activities which may cause personal spiritual harm or may show insensitivity regarding how one's behavior affects other members of the community. Those prohibited activities include; gambling, social dancing, attendance at dance clubs.

Some of these rules of conduct are matters of Christian liberty for which each student alone will be responsible for when they are no longer a student at the college. It is expected that students will temporarily set aside that freedom in these areas for the benefits of the entire community. A student's voluntary enrollment at the Seminary attests to the fact that they agree to live within the framework of the University standard of conduct as stated in the student handbook and academic catalogue. Students are obliged to honorably adhere to the standard of conduct while enrolled at the University, respecting all breaks and holidays. Behavior, either on campus or off indicating that a student has disregarded for the standard of the Seminary may be sufficient reason to ask a student to withdraw from the University.
